HOW WERE YOU AFFECTED BY THE FLOODS AND FIRES OF 2021?

Study Title: The Impacts of and Responses to Natural Disasters on Community Resilience

Researchers from the University of Alberta will be visiting Merritt in the **Summer of 2023** to conduct a study of the impacts of and responses to the fires and flooding that occurred in and near Merritt, B.C. in the Fall of 2021, and we would like to hear from you. This project is led by Dr. Debra J. Davidson, Professor in the Department of Resource Economics and Environmental Sociology.

This is meant to provide citizens with the convenience to report certain crimes online while freeing call takers and frontline staff to focus on the higher priority calls, which improves overall safety and response times in the city.

It is important to know that **not all crime can be reported** via the online process.

Citizens will be able to report the following crimes online:

- Damage/mischief to property under \$5,000
- Damage/mischief to a vehicle under \$5,000
- Hit and run to an unoccupied vehicle or property
- Theft of bicycle under \$5,000
- Theft under \$5,000
- Theft from vehicle under \$5,000
- Lost property

Incidents **must also satisfy** the following conditions to report via the online process:

- No witnesses or suspects.
- Item(s) lost or stolen must cost less than \$5,000
- Vandalized property or vehicle will cost less than \$5,000 to repair.

There are no items involving personal identity, firearms, licence plates or decals.

DO YOU NEED ACCESS TO OR THROUGH THE TRANSMOUNTAIN EXPANSION PROJECT?

DO YOU NEED TO ACCESS THE PROJECT AREA FOR HUNTING, FISHING, HARVESTING, CATTLE DRIVING, OR CULTURAL PRACTICES?

Access is normally restricted through the TransMountain Expansion Project (West Route) because of health and safety concerns. However, Coldwater have developed a **Communications Plan** with TransMountain to support Coldwater members maintaining access if they need it between now and when construction is planned to finish (September 2023).


Community Refuse Pick Up Will Be passing out notices on composting, the new C Canswill hold the composting. Compost will be ready in three weeks if it's started rite.
